Erysimum 'Jenny Brook'

E. 'Jenny Brook' is a typical example of the way in which many erysimum cultivars have been introduced – through chance events, rather than through planned breeding programmes. It was first discovered in 2001 as a chance seedling in a garden on the West coast of Wales. The gardener, Roger Handley, spotted its potential and took cuttings. From these, the plant was trialled and built up by R A Meredith & son and the cultivar was introduced commercially in 2006.
